# This page is a list of materials and consumables you will need for the Stone Setting Workshop.

## Burs needed for Stone Setting

You will need to purchase packages of these different kinds and sizes of burs for stone setting. They come in a package of 6. I like to buy several packages at a time so I always have them on hand. This can be a bit expensive, so if you are on a budget, just buy one of each unless otherwise listed.

At first glance the stone setting bur and the heart look the same, but they are not. Ball burs are easy to recognize, as named they are shaped like a ball (sphere). The stone

setting burs have straight edges and the heart burs have a sharp knife edge. You will need both kinds of burs.

## Round Cubic zirconia (CZ) for practicing setting.

CZ are great for practicing, as they are very hard and do not scratch or break easily. If you are a bit more advanced, garnets are a good stone to practice, as they are hard, but not as hard as CZ's and you can test your ability to prevent cracking or chipping a stone. I would not recommend anything softer than a 6.5 on the mohs scale. It will add difficulty to learning.

You can use any round gemstone in the same size listed below, but be careful that the stones are cut correctly as well as consistent in size and shape. Most gemstones are not cut well and are not consistent. This will cause extra frustration and make it more difficult to learn stone setting. Machine cut gems tend to be cut well and consistent. Many companies have options of matching stones shape, size, and color. Take advantage of these options, it saves time and frustration.

## Stock for rings

If you can afford it I recommend sterling silver. Practicing using silver will allow you to understand how it behaves and you will get used to working with it. This will help you when you start to sell your work. Silver has a higher perceived value, and is in much more demand than copper or brass. If you can not afford to use silver, you are welcome to use other metals.

You can purchase your ring sock at any supplier. I like Hoover and Strong, because they are 100% recycled metals and do not participate in new mining. They have a great variety of sizes. If you can not find the exact size just go up in size a bit. For example if you can not find the 2mm x 2.5mm just order more of the 2mm x 3mm.

You should come to the workshop with 3 finished rings to practice setting one to two 2.5 mm wide by 2 mm thick in any size.

1 or 2 pieces of2 mm x 2.5 mm sterling silver 12 inches1 or 2 pieces of2 mm x 3 mm sterling silver 12 inches

Rio Grande does not have the exact dimensions. If you need to purchase from them or another supplier that does not have the above size, I would purchase 8 or 10 gauge square wire and hammer it flatter to get a close dimension. Please contact me or for individual help. The size and shape of your stock will also depend on what kind of studio setup you have.

## Copper, bronze, brass, or silver sheet for practicing.

Hopefully you have some scraps already.

Not essential, but helpful to have 3 to 5 sheet metal pieces to practice on. I would use 14 gauge minimum, 12 g (2mm) is ideal, 18 g can work.

**Sandpaper 320,400,600,1500 grits.** One or more sheets for each grit wet/dry sandpaper. I like the 3M brand papers, but any brand is fine. Do not get sandpaper for wood. Wet dry for metal.
